The Detroit Lakes Wetland Managment District has been overseeing the harvesting, storage, and distribution of thousands of pounds native prairie seed for more than 20 years.

The seed is used to restore former cropland to native prairie located primarily in a local 5 county area and has converted thousands of acres during this time. Native prairie plants are vital for supporting a population of pollinators.
