# **CREATION CARE NOTE**

5 Lighting Principals for Responsible Outdoor Lighting

Useful: use light only as needed

Targeted: direct light so it falls only where it is needed

**Low level:** light should be no brighter than needed

**Controlled**: use light only when it is needed

Warm colored: use warmer color lights where possible
